Executive Secretary Hoffpauir (Mike) stated that a quorum, in accordance with the VCF ByLaws, would consist of 13 members physically present for the meeting. There were not 13 members present.

Dear Virginia Chess Federation Officers and Members:

Introduction. I (Michael E. Hoffpauir) assumed duties as Virginia Chess Federation Treasurer in late 2015 from Ernie Schlich, when he retired from the position. Every time I work on the Virginia Chess Federation's accounts I am reminded of Ernie's dedication to Virginia Chess and the effort he put into his work as our Treasurer.

Summary

- Over the past year the VCF's accounts increased substantially. As of 8/31/2022, our Total Net Worth is \$43,371.49, up about five-thousand dollars from \$38,346.05 at the end of August in 2021.
 - NOTE: VCF has \$2,024.93 in checks that have not been cashed by players or businesses, of which 49% (\$993.85) are due to checks written during FY21. The remaining are what I term "old checks" and they date back to November 2015. These are almost exclusively tournament winnings—e.g. un-cashed checks by players.

Virginia Chess Federation accounts and banking information. In accordance with the Virginia Chess Federation ByLaws of January 2018, the Virginia Chess Federation FY starts on September 1st ends the following August 31st. This report includes information for the Virginia Chess Federation Main Checking Account, the Zofchak Savings Account, and our two PayPal accounts. The numbers below assume all these out-standing checks have been cashed.

VCF Newsletter Costs & Membership income

- <u>VCF Newsletter</u>: This past year we paid \$3,442.86 to print and mail the VCF Newsletter. This is about the average cost of the Newletter.
- Membership Income. We received \$3,700 in VCF membership dues this past year (92x 1-yr Jr; 38x 2-yr Jr; 83x 1-yr Adult; 36x 2-yr Adult). Two-year Junior \$ Adult membership purchases account for just under 30% of the transactions.

Virginia Chess Federation Website:

We renewed our domain registration for vachess.org for 5 years on 11/1/2019 at a cost of \$234.90 through Network Solutions. The registration expires in 2025. On 4/23/2021, we renewed our web hosting agreement with Serverpoint.com for 12 months for \$70.92. The new expiration date is 4/16/2022. Considered together, the average cost of our vachess.org domain and website hosting is under \$10 per month.

Misc. Items:

• **Insurance:** We renewed the insurance policy with RV Nuccio insurance on February 2, 2021, at a cost of \$446.25 for the period of 3/14/21 to 3/14/22—this is the same cost as last year. The policy covers all our events. I will be renewing it again early in 2022 to cover us through March 2023.

Other Expenditures:

Hardware and software: None, but I expect to upgrade our version of Quicken during the coming year, and Macon periodically upgrades his printer or publishing software. As we pay no taxes, we don't bother to depreciate our assets.
