









## The Tournament Location






## Hallway to the Ball Room






## Floor Plan






## The Playing Room

#### How to "Check-in" at the Tournament

#### • First, THERE IS NO CHECK-IN REQUIREMENT

- If you registered online and your entry information is all correct, then you do not need to check-in.
- If you requested a Bye, please check the Tournament Website.

#### You only need to "check-in" at the Registration Desk if you:

- Need to pay your US Chess Federation member fees
- Want to change sections
- Want to Request a Bye, or you want to remove or change the Bye you selected during Registration. You cannot change Bye Requests after Round 2 has begun.



## The Playing Room ... sort of like this

- <u>Masks are encouraged, but</u> not required.
- NO spectators allowed on the floor during play
- Hand-sanitizer and Sanitizing
   Wipes will be at players' tables



- We are providing all chess sets, boards, and Chess Notation Sheets
- BRING YOUR OWN PENCILS / PENS (for chess notation)
- Bring your own CLOCK ... and set it before you enter the playing hall



## "Sections" and What They Mean

- There are 9 Sections in the tournament based on players' current Grade:
  - K-12 & K-12 Under 1400
  - K-8 & K-8 Under 1200
  - K-5 & K-5 Under 1000
  - K-3 & K-3 Under 600
  - College
- What these Grade grouping mean
  - K-12 is for players in grades Pre-K through High School
  - K-3 is for players in grades Pre-K through 3<sup>rd</sup> Grade
  - A 5<sup>th</sup> Grader can "play up" in the K-8 or K-12 Section, but an 11<sup>th</sup> Grader cannot "play down" into a lower section.

## Players' "Ratings" and How We Use Them

#### Player's Ratings

- A "rating" is a number (from 100 to about 2900) representing a player's relative strength based on opposition they have faced in other rated chess tournaments.
  - A Grandmaster is rated 2400 or higher
  - An Expert is rated 2000-2200
- The only games that count toward a player's US Chess rating are games played in tournaments that are rated by the US Chess Federation. Games played on ChessKid.com, Chess.com, LiChess, etc., have no impact on a player's US Chess rating unless they are rated by US Chess (rare).
- For this tournament we use the higher of each player's over-the-board rating and online rating from the US Chess Federations March Rating Supplement.


## Some Important Chess Rules to Know ...

Topic	Example	Consequences / Comments
Illegal Moves	<ul> <li>Player incorrectly moves a piece or a pawn.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>The player's opponent receives 2 extra minutes of time (but only if the game is being played using a chess clock)</li> </ul>
Touch-Move	<ul> <li>A player touches her Knight, but then moves her Queen.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>The player must move the piece that was touched first</li> <li>This is usually not a time penalty, but it can be for repeated offenses</li> </ul>
Castling	<ul> <li>Player moves the Rook first, then the King</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>"Castling" is a KING's MOVE. Move the King First!!!</li> <li>If you move the Rook first, then you have made a Rook move.</li> </ul>
Un-sportsman- like Conduct	<ul> <li>Talking during your game</li> <li>Making noises</li> <li>Trying to force your opponent to move</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>This can be a time penalty</li> <li>If your "talking" is giving move information to another player or saying something to another player like "that's a bad move", then you could immediately lose your own game.</li> </ul>
Chess Notation	A player is not taking Chess Notation	<ul> <li>REQUIRED in College and all K12, K8, and K-5CH sections</li> <li>Failure to take notation can be penalized</li> <li>Not required, but HIGHLY ENCOURAGED, in any K3 section and the K5 Under 1000 section</li> </ul>




## Some Important Chess Rules to Know ...

Topic	Example	Consequences / Comments
Board Setup Incorrectly	<ul> <li>Queen and King on wrong squares</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>If more than 10 moves have been played, the game cannot be re-started.</li> </ul>
Bathroom	Player asks permission to go to the Restroom	<ul> <li>You do not need to ask</li> <li>If there is a clock on the game, the clock continues to run.</li> <li>You cannot stop or pause the clock to go to the Restroom.</li> </ul>
Player Refuses to Move	<ul> <li>Player is in a "lost" position, and knows it</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>This is a type of un-sportsman-like conduct</li> <li>It can result in your game being ruled a loss, including other penalties</li> </ul>
Capturing the Opponent's King	<ul> <li>Player leaves his/her King in Check, and the opponent captures it on the next move</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>This means the player who left their King in check has made an illegal move</li> <li>"Capturing the King" is not permitted</li> <li>The Tournament Director will return the position to the move made before the King was captured and then enforce the "Touch-Move Rule" for the offending player, plus a time penalty of 2 minutes added to the opponent's clock.</li> </ul>



## Pairings and Players' Ratings ...

- Pairings: "Swiss System"
  - Everyone plays 5 rounds (4 in College and P&F) ... this is NOT an "Elimination Event"
  - For Round 1: All players are rank-ordered according to their US Chess Rating. Players without ratings are listed in a random sequence.
  - For Round 2: Winners from Round 1 are paired against other Round 1 winners; Players who did not win play others who did not win
  - WE TRY TO AVOID pairing players from the same school as much as possible. However, as we get deeper into the tournament this becomes a more difficult guideline to follow.






## Have a Problem or Question during Your Game?

 Don't wait until your game is over to raise your concern!!

- **DO NOT argue** with your opponent
- Don't ask your opponent "what's the rule about...?" You'll get a bad answer.
- Raise your hand and summon a
   Tournament Director to your table
  - Pause your Clock
  - Calmly state your issue
  - If your opponent is making the claim DO NOT interrupt him/her ... you will get a chance to tell "your side" of the issue






# Reporting Your Game Results

#### What to do when your game is done ...


- Raise your hand to summon the Tournament Director
- DO NOT re-set your chess board until the TD instructs you to re-set it
- Complete the Game Result Slip
- Your game result is not official until the TD validates it and initials the Result Slip



## Cell Phone Policy

- TURNED OFF and PLACED FACE-DOWN ON YOUR TABLE. Do not take your phone to the Bathroom or outside of the Playing Hall until your game is FINISHED.
  - Give it to your parents
- If you leave your phone on ...
  - And it rings ... 10 minutes off your clock (1st Offense); Loss of Game (2nd Offense)
  - If you answer the phone ... instant Loss of Game
  - If it buzzes because you received email or text ... 10 minutes off your clock
- If you take your phone out of the Playing Room while you are playing
  - Very likely to result in instant Loss of Game
